If you think you are going to Canada, you might just end up in Alaska. Come to our next meeting this Saturday and hear Dale Hemman in a special WINGS seminar at the KCLM terminal.

At our last meeting on March 23, Tim Riley gave CCPA members and a whole lot of visitors a great presentation:"Going to Boeing and Knowing". Speaking to a packed house at Coldwell Banker, Tim stressed the importance of keeping out of SEATAC's class B airspace. Pilots are also encouraged to avoid flights over noise sensitive neighborhoods. So what's the easiest and best route to accomplish both goals when flying from Port Angeles? Probably by flying over West Seattle.

For Northflow traffic report Boeing Tower when slightly north of Vashon Island. Fly over the shoreline at 1500 feet and begin a decent into compressed airspace. Fly parallel to east/west roads descending to 1000 feet and report when south and abeam the West Seattle Reservoir.. Continue your descent to 800 feet for a very short downwind approach west of the 31R/13L. Two tricky items to remember: 1 The West Seattle Reservoir has been covered over, but is still recognizable. 2 Know where departing traffic is and where prominent landmarks are.
