Chuck Jones will be our speaker on Emergency Communications. This is really a follow up to the Jim Buck/ Penny Linterman meeting in June. At the June meeting, Jim expressed the concern that communications and alternate forms of transportation were critical concerns when a disaster could make transportation by roads and highways difficult if not impossible. Since pilots offer alternate forms of transportation and communication, CCPA members could become a critical part of any relief effort.

When Jim became a part of a disaster drill in Joyce it became evident that critical services that were needed were unavailable. One of the most critical was the transportation of prescription drugs, blood, search dogs, and other small items. At that meeting Jim indicated that personnel that were previously determined to be critical were too busy trying to get help for their own families and neighbors to help out in any planned relief efforts. "We'll take help from whoever can offer it regardless of whether they have a FEMA card or not!"

I'm only guessing, but I suspect that Chuck Jones wishes to follow prescribed FEMA procedures. His group has also held emergency exercises. So it will be interesting to compare the Jones and Buck approaches to disaster.

COMMUNITY OPEN HOUSE ANNOUNCEMENT PROPOSED REVISIONS TO THE AIRPORT OVERLAY DISTRICT AROUND SEQUIM VALLEY AIRPORT

WHAT:	The Clallam County Department of Community Development staff invites you to attend an Open House to view an informational presentation, discuss and address local issues and concerns related to proposed revisions to the Airport Overlay District around Sequim Valley Airport.
WHEN:	6:30 to 8:00 pm, August 24, 2006 <i>(Doors will open at 6:00 pm)</i>
WHY:	Present background information, rationale, and revisions to address June 15 th , 2005 Public Hearing citizen testimony.
WHERE:	Greywolf Elementary Gymnasium

Why Am I Receiving This Notice?

You are receiving this notice because your property is within the boundaries of the proposed revisions to the Airport Overlay District around Sequim Valley Airport.

Why Is The County Proposing An Airport Overlay District?

Land uses surrounding airports can increase hazards both to people and property on the ground, aircraft occupants, and can adversely impact the future operation of the airport. State law requires Clallam County to discourage the siting of incompatible land uses adjacent to general aviation airports (RCW 36.70.547) and to preserve the operation of general aviation airports as essential public facilities (RCW 36.70A.200).

Is This A Public Hearing?

No, this is an open house format that will consist of an informational presentation, a question and answer period, and an opportunity for citizens to offer comments on proposed revisions to the Airport Overlay District prior to the Public Hearing.

What Activities Are Subject To The Proposed Airport Overlay District?

The proposed Airport Overlay District regulations would only apply to new development requiring a Clallam County building or land use permit. Pre-existing land uses, lots, buildings, and structures that were lawfully established are exempt; however, changes to such uses would still need to comply with the proposed Airport Overlay District standards.

Will There Be Other Open Houses For The Other Clallam County Airports?

Yes, each general aviation airport in Clallam County will have an open house. Dates for other airports to be determined.
