Our Guest Speaker for Our September 18th meeting will be Randall McCoy

Randall is employed by the Lower Elwha Skallam Tribe at the fish hatchery. He has a degree from Western Washington University. At the moment Randall promotes ATAPA or Active Transportation Advocacy of Port Angeles. Randall is very active in encouraging folks to log into the National Bike Challenge and Washington Bikes to encourage biking activity. When I visited Randall at his work site, he seemed interested in finding out more about the Pilots Loop Around KCLM. When I asked Randall to



show me a profile of the southern part of our Loop he immediately went to Google Maps and in a short time produced the profile. As I watched Randall obtain this profile I was very impressed at how quickly he worked and how he could make his hatchery computer almost sing. His skills could prove beneficial in our efforts to establish the Pilots Loop.

When I asked Randall how we could make our Pilots Loop trail become a reality, he answered that we would have to turn to several government entities. His thoughts paralleled mine. This cooperation between government entities is already beginning to happen as Rich James of the Clallam County Road Department has offered to lend his Thursday Volunteer Group to the Port for the maintenance job of the first 570 feet of our “trail” starting at the 18th street ODT trailhead. However, Randall may have other suggestions as how to proceed. We also need to find out more about ATAPA. Perhaps, this organization has a role to play in establishing our Pilots Loop Around KCLM.

As pilots we are all interested in enhancing the use of our airport. We know that our FBO has endorsed our loop project, but pilots need to give us support if this project is to become a reality. Please make every effort to attend our September 18th meeting. As the pilot population keeps aging, we need to listen to the dynamic folks of the younger generation, like Randall McCoy.

What’s In Your Hangar?

“Pilots who spruced up their hangars with a couch, chairs, refrigerator and a radio, or who set up tool chests to work on their aircraft at times found themselves running afoul of an FAA policy prohibiting nonaeronautical uses of hangars at federally funded airports.

“ The FAA’s intent was to prevent nonaeronautical uses of hangars from displacing legitimate aeronautical uses, not to punish those who make their hangars a comfortable place to hang out. The agency has drafted a new policy to more clearly define what is and what is not an acceptable use of a hangar.”

Minutes of CCPA Executive Committee Board Meeting
September 3, 2014

Meeting opened at 7:15 PM by Chairman Jerry Nichols.

Also present: Gary Johnson, Gene Rimov, Bob Hicks.

The minutes of the August 6, 2014 Executive Board Meeting were approved as sent out.

Jerry Nichols reported that the Treasurer reports that we have \$3,426.37 in our checking account.

Old Business:

Propose Trail Around KCLM: Gene Rimov reported on current status. Peninsula Trails Coalition has funds available to do the brush cleanup work. Gene stated he had visited with Jerry Ludke, airport manager, to discuss the matter. J. Ludke will discuss with Rick James, County Road Dep't Planner. J. Nichols questioned G. Rimov regarding lunch costs for the volunteer cleanup workers, which Gene estimated to be in the range of \$75 - \$100 total. Board members expressed a willingness for CCPA to pay this. It was noted that the work currently under consideration is on the north side of the airport.

Lincoln Park Trees: J. Nichols reported that 8 trees had been removed which has resulted in the FAA cancelling the night GPS approach NOTAM. Funding is due in October for the Environmental Impact Statement needed regarding removal of all the trees.

New Business:

Jerry Nichols suggested the Board invite Dennis Toepke to be a member. Members present approved the idea.

Road Safety – Airport Entrance/Exit: CCPA is suggesting a 4-way stop be instituted at the Airport Rd/Lauridsen Blvd/Edgewood Dr. intersection. Increased use of roadways by loaded logging trucks and trailers is considered potentially hazardous without a formal requirement to stop before turning. J. Nichols will discuss with J. Ludke.

Safety Breakfast – Venue Change: It is possible that Priscilla's new café will be open in about a month. Members will check it out and report before any decision to move from current venue. Members discussed a recent suggestion that Coburn's Café be considered but concluded it was better to make one change instead of the potential for two if the first was unsatisfactory.
