
FROM THE PRESIDENT'S HANGAR DECEMBER 2008

Another site with scanned in current charts that can be overlaid with weather and other information.





January 8, 2009 ADS-B, what is it? With speaker Vaughn Burgess of Definitive Avionics based at KBLI.

Is this a requirement? How does it benefit me? What are the costs? Why ADS-B?
