Grant recently caught a ride to Stuart Island from his son Sean. The flight was noteworthy because Sean had passed his check ride just a few days earlier. Sean, who is a senior civil engineering student at Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, California, took his flight training this summer through Pigs Can Fly Aviation at SBP. 
