On Final, the President's Corner

There's no question that recent increases in fuel, food and other commodities have begun to change the habits of many Americans, including pilots who fly for fun. Gas prices in particular have gone up dramatically and are already changing our transportation patterns. People are already buying smaller cars, car pooling, riding mass transit or changing to four day work weeks instead of five.

Rental prices continue to creep up in an attempt by Fixed Based Operators to try to cover their escalating costs. Will those who fly for fun stop driving to the airport as often? Will they fly fewer hours because of the cost of the drive to get there or will they make longer or more flights each time they fly to make up for their less frequent trips. Maybe they'll eat out less or switch to domestic beer to continue flying as often. A clear picture hasn't emerged yet and, in fact, may not. After all, pilots are an independent sort and pretty much do what they want.

One thing is clear, especially from the traffic count from the control tower, and that is that the direct and indirect cost of flying is going up. So it makes sense to maximize that costly air time.

One way to do that is to strive to make each flight a learning experience. There are many ways in which to do just that. You can go to a new and unfamiliar airport or destination. Consult the Aircraft Maneuvers handbook and try perfecting stalls, slow flight and steep turns. Descending spirals are always fun. Or how about some advanced ground reference maneuvers like eights on pylons or eights around pylons. If you find that you're having a little trouble, get an instructor on the same page with you. Maybe commit and be passionate about that new license or rating. Each flight will have a specific purpose, and at the end of each flight, with your newfound proficiency, experience and abilities, the expense will have been well worth it.

As always our program chairperson Maureen Griggs has an exiting line up of excellent speakers for this up coming season of WPA starting with Bryan Dudas. Please check the speaker flyer and the newsletter for the current meeting place.

100LL Avgas prices within 55 miles of KBLI




Monthly Speakers


