Meeting minutes for the September 5, 2003 meeting were approved.

John Dobson reminded us that officer and director elections for our chapter will be next WPA meeting on November 7, 2003. We will be electing President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and one Director who will serve a three year term.

Jim Faustina announced that the Aviation Maintenance programs for the next morning were on Short Term and Long Term Storage of Aircraft Engines and Aircraft Hardware. These sessions have been well attended.

Kevin Kelley will be taking over Aviation Academy this spring. Some of the former leaders of this activity will be assisting him as he takes on this important program.

On Saturday December 13, 2003 there will be a family day event at the Goodrich Hanger. They are looking for General Aviation display aircraft for this event. The event is from 10:00AM - 4:00PM. Contact Stephanie if you are able to display your aircraft. She will be looking for a variety of airplanes to display for their event.

We had a great fly out to Hoquiam last weekend. The weather was wonderful and we had a large turn out. Some of our members continued on to Westport after lunch while others took a walk through the bird sanctuary.

The Christmas party is on December 5, 2003. The theme is going to be 100 years of flight. Get your reservations in early. The registration form is in the news letter. The Airport is giving out free coupons at the Christmas part redeemable for a new sectional at the local FBOs. (Thank you Dave Waggoner!)

Legislative Affairs - Get letters off to your legislators on the contract tower subject. Let them know how you feel about this issue.

We had several new members at our October meeting which was held at our new facility, the Sno-Isle skills center. This is a great place for us to meet right across from the airport.

Tower begins operations on October 15, but it will be dedicated on October 31, 2003.

Dave Waggoner reported that the Flight Interpretive Center is going very well. The conceptual design costs about 2 Million more than the budget, so they are still working out details.

All of the new hangers built recently at Paine Field have been rented. Dave has some very large hanger space available for those who are interested. Paine is now up to 550 airplanes making it the largest General Aviation airport in the State of Washington! Chip Davidson commented on the high quality of the airplanes and aircraft owners that Dave Waggoner has attracted to the field by building the new hangers.

George Luck announced that Harvey Field is having Saturday night at the movies again. These events are the first Saturday of the month beginning in November through March. Come at 7:00PM and enjoy a classic aviation film and the company of your fellow aviators.

We are going to have the Culinary Arts group provide the meal next meeting. This will cost \$10.00 per person at the door. You must RSVP if you want dinner at the November meeting. You may do this by visiting the WPA web site at <a href="https://www.wpa-painefield.org">www.wpa-painefield.org</a>.

Our program was by Seattle Avionics. They provide us with a live demonstration of Voyager, their flight planning software. This product was will received with many WPA members taking advantage of the generous discount they offered us at the meeting.

#### **Board Meeting Minutes - October 9, 2003**

Safety And Education - Owner Maintenance seminars on Saturday mornings are going very well. We are getting a lot of participation including many people who are not WPA members yet.

The WINGS Program is set for April. Eric Allais is updating our WINGS Program book in preparation for this event.

We are preparing our "Year in Review" of all the fly outs we had this year and what we are doing next year. The calendar for 2004 was set during the September Board Meeting.

Dave Wagoner volunteered to get a program for us next year. We are thinking that we should get a program together on aviation fire safety. We have never had a presentation on this subject but several of us either have had or know people who have had an aircraft on fire.

We are thinking of having some sort of swap meet on a Saturday. This event may replace the July meeting and woud be held on Saturday.

We believe that our first meeting in our new facility (Snow Isle Skills Center) was a great success. We think that this was a good move for us.

Fly out attendance has been on the increase! For the first time in many months we are now filling up available seats in the participating airplanes.

Dave Waggoner advised us of the "Airports and Compatible Land Use" document that has been produced by the Washington State Department of Transportation. Dave provided copies of this 40+ page document to several of us. Dave told us that although the Washington State DOT intended for this document to protect airports it has also been used to prevent airport development in some areas.

Dave is thinking of expanding the Paine Field Happenings to a more Snohomish County wide publication.

On Monday October 13, 2003 Paine Tower will be open from 10:00AM - 4:00PM. We think that the tower will be available for tours during this time. It may be one of the few times that any of us get to see the new facility. Tower will be dedicated on October 30th. You must RSVP to attend. Bring your camera as this will likely be a great photo opportunity.

Dick Kinnier is very happy with the new membership package that we now have. We are working on processes that will get the membership packages out to the new members more quickly.

The State WPA is working on accepting Credit Cards for various purchases. A significant number of people used their credit card to join WPA at the Arlington fly in this year. The State WPA is working on scholarships plan. They are considering numerous options. They are considering giving a grant to Gary Evans. State WP is also thinking of contributing funds to Rick Larson in order to get his attention on this subject. Dave Waggoner suggested that we might consider hiring a professional lobby person.

We had a lengthy discussion regarding what we would like the State WPA organization to do for all of us. Many of us are concerned that the State WPA is looking to spend our money on scholarships when we believe that some of the more basic needs of the organization are not being met very well. We concluded that we need to talk to a significant number of the other WPA chapters to see if they share our views in order to determine whether or not we can find a grass roots consensus.
