Like it or not we need four methods to communicate with our members. They are as follows:

We hope to change that dynamic over the next 5 or 6 months. Beginning with the membership renewal notices you will see a Member Profile request. We first need to create a demographic profile of our members with emphasis on interests and needs. The ultimate goal is to create a Secure Web Front-end in Access (a database system) and then create a List Server.

Imagine "backcountry" PAE pilots with the unique ability to post a question to like minded WPA members in Spokane on Friday evening about campsite logistics in Republic on Saturday? What about an IFR rated pilot looking for a safety pilot on Saturday at 2pm in Renton? This is NOT a chat room! This is NOT a user group forum. Think of it this way. We invite new members to attend our monthly general meetings, have a bite to eat, shake a few hands and hopefully make contact someone of interest. It's almost as bad as going to a pick-up bar for a date. (And, NO! This is not going to be John's dating service!)

This is going to be a member driven service designed to bring members and chapters closer together in real time. The development and ultimate use will be member profile and interests. When the product is ready for testing we will have a computer skills class later in 2004 to help you understand it.
