New Look for Boeing Everett Factory Doors

Images of flight adorning Everett factory doors The next step in giving the Everett, Wash., factory a new look begins today with the application of decals on all six factory doors. These decals will include pictures of people, airplanes and the new Boeing livery.

The old decals were recently removed and a 27-foot blue stripe was painted on the bottom of each door. The stripe is intended to keep the decals above ground and away from potential damage.

The new images are intended to convey the excitement of flying and employees' passion for the aerospace industry. The 40-21 building will be the first to receive a new decal, which will show a woman with her arms stretched to her sides to represent the wings of an airplane. This door is scheduled to be completed by Oct. 21.

The decal images will span the entirety of the doors, four of which are 82 feet high by 300 feet wide and two of which are 82 feet high by 350 feet wide. Painted decals typically last about 10 years before beginning to fade. Application of the decals should be finished by Nov. 11, weather permitting.
