Are most of you are aware that Fliteline very kindly offers a fuel discount to WPA members. In case not, let me review: Who is eligible? Paine Field WPA members in good standing (current dues paid). How do I obtain the discount? If you don't have a BP card, obtain an application from Fliteline and get one. Take your BP card to Fliteline and fill out the discount application for a \$0.25 per gallon discount. Fliteline's application asks for a WPA member number. Since we don't issue numbers, mark that space n/a. If you don't want a BP card, you may apply with your regular card for \$0.15 per gallon discount. If you use Arlington for fuel, validate any credit card you prefer and have Fliteline note it for use at Arlington. Due to the vagaries of the billing system you MUST use a different card at Paine than Arlington. If any of the above isn't clear, please call me at 206-546-3634 and we'll try to straighten it out.

Tim Adamson, Nash Creek Aviation, the new guy on the block by Freddy Flyboy

Nash Creek Aviation, owned by Tim Adamson, is the new tenant in the WWII building at the South end of the West Ramp at PAE. Tim relocated here last September from Atlanta, GA. Tim was hooked by the Aviation bug at an early age from watching a TV cartoon show "Skyhawk" (The Cartoon FBO had a B17 and Sopwith Camel). As he grew up under the flight path of Huey Helicopters, he wished one would land so he could get up close. This stimulated his interest in becoming a helicopter pilot. He was told his eyesight was not good enough to fly Hueys, so he worked his way into an aviation career in the airport equipment business and for 20 years sold ground support equipment for the largest distributor on the East Coast. He started flying and soloed in Supercubs and has owned several Cessnas. Not to be discouraged, he continued on to earn a commercial helicopter rating and a multi-engine ATP rating.

In 1999, with a dive in the stock market, aviation business on the East Coast also took a dive. A trip to Orcus Island, to pick up a T34, reminded him how nice it was in the Pacific NW. Then in a trade publication, he saw the ad for a WWII hangar for lease at Paine Field. Since Tim was a teenager, he had dreamed of having a FBO located in a WWII hangar. Tim said he was going through a mid-life crisis and instead of buying the red sport car, he bought a red pickup and leased the WWII hangar at Paine Field.

Nash Creek Aviation will be a full FBO, with hangar space for lease (119 x 102 ft, 28 ft high), shop and office space for lease, maintenance for helicopters, Cessnas and Beechcraft. The future plans are for a fuel service and kitchen facilities for catering. Tim stated, "This area is a wonderful environment for aviation, and with the scenery of snowcapped mountains and Puget sound, I am here to stay."
