2013 Scholarship Application
**Flight Training and Aviation
Studies**



One or more scholarships in the amount of \$1000.00 will be awarded by the Spokane Chapter of the Washington Pilots Association. Successful applicants will be informed by email in January 2014.

To be eligible applicants must meet criteria listed below.

Scholarships may be used for flight training, completing academic studies to meet FAA requirements for airframe & powerplant mechanic, Inspection Authorization, avionics technician, academic studies for aircraft dispatcher, or for academic study leading to a degree in an aviation related field of engineering or management.

All scholarship applicants must be currently enrolled in or accepted into an aviation related program that leads to a two year or four year degree, or an advanced degree at any accredited educational institution, or be a flight student in a flight school teaching under FAR Part 141, or be studying with a flight instructor who teaches under FAR Part 61.

To be eligible an applicant must:

- If applying under FAR Part 61, have passed the FAA written test appropriate for the particular certificate or rating the applicant is working toward.
- If a flight student, be actively engaged in flight training with an appropriate flight instructor if training is under FAR Part 61 and be showing satisfactory progress. Or, be enrolled and in good standing in a flight training program under FAR Part 141. Or be enrolled and accepted into an aviation training or educational program at an academic institution located in the Inland Empire that will result in a two, four year, or advanced degree in a field of study that will prepare the applicant for a career in aviation.
- If a flight student possess a current student pilot certificate and hold a current medical if engaged in primary pilot training, or hold at least a private pilot license if working toward an advanced rating (including tail wheel endorsement, instrument rating, or seaplane rating).
- If a student pilot working toward a Private Pilot license, have soloed, have logged at least 3 takeoffs and landings within the last 90 days, and be demonstrating acceptable progress toward completion of the license. The student's CFI must attest to the applicant's satisfactory progress in their letter of recommendation.
- If a Private Pilot or above, have logged 3 takeoffs and landings within the past 90 days.
- If a student at an academic institution enrolled in a course leading to an aviation related two or four year degree, or an aviation related maintenance technician or dispatch certificate, be enrolled full time, and demonstrate satisfactory academic progress toward completing the course of study.

Instructions and additional criteria:

1. All Applicants must be residents of the Inland Empire
2. **Incomplete applications will not be considered.**
3. **Materials submitted to the Washington Pilots Association with your application will not be returned.**
4. The applicant must complete Sections A, B, and C. **Applications must be typed.** A representative of the applicant's school, or CFI if studying under FAR Part 61, must complete the box at the beginning of Section A, certifying that the applicant is enrolled and in good standing.
5. If applying for a flight training scholarship attach a photocopy of your student or current pilot certificate, current medical and logbook page(s) showing your total hours with the last date flown, solo endorsement/currency and a copy of your written test results.
6. If enrolled in a college or university program leading to an aviation related degree provide a copy of your high school transcripts, and a certified copy of your college transcripts.

7. Include two letters of reference. One letter must be from a personal reference and the other from someone working in the aviation industry who knows you.
8. The applicant must submit a type written statement that outlines personal goals, how training will be used, and a description of financial need. Also describe what has drawn you to aviation. Your statement must be no longer than three pages, double spaced, using Times New Roman 12 point font.
9. **Applications and supporting materials must be in one envelope, postmarked on or before December 14, 2013.**

10. The scholarship will be awarded at the Washington Pilots Association, Spokane Chapter Benefit Auction held in March 2014. Successful applicants are requested to attend.
11. Acceptance of the scholarship constitutes permission for the Washington Pilots Association to use their name and photograph.
12. The scholarship recipient may be asked to attend a WPA, Spokane Chapter meeting to report on their progress during the year following the award.
13. This scholarship is need-based, however academic performance will be considered.
14. Funds will be paid directly to the educational institution, flight school, FBO, or instructor to be applied toward flight training or tuition at a college, university, or trade school. Please have a representative from your school or your Flight Instructor sign below, certifying that funds will only be applied to flight training or academic tuition costs.
