A special day is being planned for Felts Field this summer. Felts Field General Aviation Day will be held on Saturday, June 4th.



It's an event designed to open Felts Field up to the community, especially the surrounding neighborhoods, so local residents can see first-hand what happens at a general aviation airport and why Felts Field is important to our area.

A special attraction that weekend is the appearance of "Aluminum Overcast"—One of the few Boeing B-17's still flying today. The aircraft is operated by the Experimental Aircraft Association and is in Spokane through the efforts of EAA Chapter 79 at Felts Field.

Planning for the event is still underway but folks can expect to see a wide variety of aircraft on display, including the Boeing 40C—the first passenger aircraft model Boeing built. It's based right here at Felts Field. In addition, there will be numerous aircraft on display including biplanes, aerobatic aircraft, and helicopters. Also on the lineup will be formation flyovers from some of the antique aircraft based at Felts Field. Food and beverages will be available. Runway work now underway at Spokane International Airport

Airlines move over to 7/25

The Runway 3-21 Line of Sight (LOS) Project is now underway at Spokane International Airprt (KGEG). Aircraft take-offs and



landings will be shifted to the alternate 8,199 foot long runway 7/25, while the northeast end of the airfield is prepared for construction, navigational aids are disabled, and new security fencing is installed. Residents on Spokane's South Hill may notice a change in the pattern of aircraft arrivals, as the alternate runway is aligned with 40th Avenue.

As of April 14th, the main runway will re-open at a shortened length of 6,852' from Taxiway Foxtrot to the Runway 3 threshold. The entire project will be completed and main runway's full 11,002' will be operational and with full CAT III Instrument Landing System (ILS) on both ends on October 20, 2011 barring any weather-related or other delays.



Airport Update

Lower Granite work party scheduled

A phone call from Paul Wolf, Director of Maintenance for State Airports, has indicated good progress has been made in working out the lease agreements with the Army Corps of Engineers on the Snake River Airports. The final paperwork and studies are being completed and there is no expected delay in the Snake River Canyon Airports opening June 1st.

Permits are being worked on to be able to control weeds on the runways, as well as any paths leading to and from the runways. Interest has been raised to keep the airports open for a longer season. Currently the airports open June 1st and close Oct 1st. There has been no sign of rejection of the request at this time, but don't expect the runways to be plowed if snow is covering the surface.



With this news the Spokane Chapter of the WPA is planning a Work Party at Lower Granite State Airport May 21st. Path clean up and mowing grass around the

segmented circle will be some of the chores. A windsock pole may be upgraded this year as well.

These are great get-a-ways, especially at the Boyer Park Resort and Marina, at Lower Granite State Airport. Come down and join the work party group. Bring liquids and yard tools. We have lunch at the resort store around noon, do some hanger flying and have a great time. The work starts at 10 a.m.

Keep your skills sharp on the ground

With spring flying season here it is time to knock the dust and cobwebs off our favorite aircraft and get ready for the flying season. Just as important to our flying safety as prepping our bird for flight after winter storage is the prepping of our mind for safe flight operations. It is time to clear the mind and brush up on the proper techniques and skills required to operate the aircraft safely and proficiently.

Remember to review operating procedures for airport surface operations at your local airport and the airports that you frequent. Review the runway signage and what they mean. Brush up on proper radio phraseology and practice clear and concise radio communication skills. All of these skill sets can assist you in avoiding becoming a runway incursion statistic.
