Flight medical exam secrets revealed

There was a record turnout for Dr. Chris Taylor's "Medical Gotchas" FAA Wings program at the November WPA/Spokane chapter meeting. Pilots from all over eastern Washington and north Idaho attended the two-hour seminar covering all facets of the FAA medical process, reviews, approvals, denials, and special issuances. Showing a picture of the staff at the Renton, WA offices, Dr. Taylor introduced us to the folks you'll be talking to should an issue need reviewed in the Northwest/



Mountain region. Of course, your medical information is still warehoused in Oklahoma, but the regional office is where you want to start to speak with an actual person. They have all of your files just a few mouse clicks away.

Much of "the mystery behind the medical" was unveiled during this discussion. Things like: How pilot's are generally a 'healthier bunch,', how a denial may NOT necessarily be the "end" of your flying (Special Issuances, AASI's and six-year authorizations, for example), and some of the ways the Seattle Flight Surgeon's office can help you get your medical back, should you have a disqualifying condition.

The second part of Dr. Taylor's message addressed how to prolong our flying years with simple life-style changes shown statistically to improve your life, and help you pass your next flight-physical;

Rules to follow: Lose weight, Eat Right (smaller portions including veggies, fruits & whole-grains), get rest, manage stress, don't smoke, don't drink alcohol in excess, stay active (park far away from the mall entrance), and lastly-find your passion. Most pilots have already done just that with their love of flying.

Other practical tips for the day of your exam include: Don't smoke, chew tobacco, or drink coffee or caffeinated beverages before your exam (at least 1 hour). arrive early, and... just relax in the doctors waiting room for 15 minutes before they see you.

How many of us rush in to see the doctor, running late, and are thrown onto the table to have what? Your blood pressure checked! Maybe that's why the magazines are so boring in the waiting room.

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A different kind of Biennial Flight Review by Dave Lucke



In June I had scheduled a visit to Herndon, Virginia to visit my sister and family. The visit was planned for November 5th. Dennis Gibbs is my brother-in-law and he was working for the EDS division of HP at the time.

One of his associates by the name of Mike Gilbert is an instrument and multi-engine flight instructor for Aviation Adventures in Leesburg, VA.

Aviation Adventures has fairly new equipment. The oldest airplane is a 2005 model. There are 172's, 182's, Columbia's, and a couple of Diamond Twin Stars just to mention a few of the aircraft based at Leesburg and Manasses, Virginia.

So I decided to schedule my BFR with Mike Gilbert in a Skyhawk SP with the Garmin 1000 glass cockpit. The Skylanes were already scheduled.

The review started with a familiarization of the IFR and VFR charts around Leesburg. It's overwhelming as there is a lot going on in this airspace. We then went over to the Garmin 1000 "big screen TV" where Mike showed me the most important features of the system. It is a very "feature rich" system but designed to be fairly intuitive. It's good to learn these things on the ground and not in the airplane with the instrument hood on.

Next, we went out to the airplane. It's pretty much like the 172 I flew years ago. During the preflight I noticed there are a total of 13 fuel sump drains. Mike mentioned that there were probably 13 defense lawyers in the most recent fuel contamination lawsuit.

We departed Leesburg to the west, cleared the veil of the Bravo airspace and flew to Winchester. I had my foggles on so missed out on the clear day with lots of fall colors. Dennis was in the back seat taking pictures. The 172 has a King two axis autopilot that couples to the GPS or ILS and is WAAS certified. We did a few approaches and a couple of touch and go's then returned to Leesburg. I hand flew the airplane most of the time but Mike wanted to show me how to use the autopilot which worked flawlessly.

Mike said that Aviation Adventures is by far the most professional and best run FBO/flight school he has ever been associated with.

The Leesburg airport is about the same size and home for about the same number of aircraft as Felts Field in Spokane. Felts has a control tower - Leesburg does not have a control tower. The Leesburg airport supports Aviation Adventures, one other flight school, and another full service FBO.

As I walked out to the parking lot I had to ask myself why this airport is a hub of activity and Felts Field can't even support an FBO? What is wrong

with the picture at KSFF?
