The Recreational Aviation Foundation has a single mission: "Keeping the legacy of recreational aviation strong by preserving, maintaining and creating public use recreational and backcountry airstrips nationwide."

The RAF implements its mission through several guiding principles: As a volunteer-driven organization, the RAF works to develop partnerships in protecting the common interest of the recreational flying community. They works in cooperation with public and private landowners/managers and aviation advocacy organizations on state and national levels. They advocate that aviation is a valid and appropriate way to access recreational opportunities on public or private land and that access to backcountry is well served by low-impact airstrips as trailheads.

An important component of their mission is that recreational aviation is enhanced and landowners are better protected by including aviation in each state's Recreational Use Statute and they are working in many states, including Washington during the current Legislative session.

And finally, aviation safety through pilot education is paramount to the successful use and enjoyment of backcountry airstrips.

Of course, along with the great food is our annual silent auction with great pilot supplies and services in the lineup as well as other great items. The proceeds go to our scholarship fund, Hutton Fly Out, Veterans Fly Out and other chapter activities. Tickets are still available and only \$35 for the dinner and program. 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Availability of aircraft maintenance and avionics at GEG no longer up in the clouds

With the recent sale of the XN Air and Spokane Airways FBOs to Ross Aviation, the future of the maintenance and avionics shops at Geiger Field were in question. Two longtime members of the aircraft community stepped up opening Aircraft Solutions LLC in the location previously used by XN Air. Flying Farmers back in Moses Lake on February 4th

The Washington Flying Farmer Pilot's Safety Seminar will be this coming Saturday, Feb. 4th at Big Bend Community College in Moses Lake. Sign in is 9:30 a.m. and seminar begins at 10 a.m. and goes to 3:30 p.m. Lunch break is from noon to 1 p.m. Also, be sure to bring a lunch. The nearest restaurants are in town, about 15 minutes from the airport... not much time to go and eat during the lunch break. Refreshments will be available.

Three FAA Wings seminars will be offered at this event well attended even. Complete all three seminars and you've got all the ground work done you will need to earn your 'Basic' FAA Wings. Do about 30 minutes of air work (later, on your own time and nickel) and you've got your FAA Wings, plus you have a BFR. For CAP types this qualifies as a "person-to-person" safety seminar.

You may also receive a break on your aircraft/pilot insurance if you participate in recurrent training such as this program. Not all insurance companies offer a discount, but some do.

If you pre-register online it's more likely that you'll get FAA Wings credit if your hand writing is at all ambiguous... I sometimes have difficulty reading names and emails from the sign in sheets when it's time to award your credits for FAA Wings events.
