Changes coming to Spokane Airport FBO's by Greg Kessinger, Spokane Airways

Effective January 10, 2012, Spokane Airways Flight Center is selling their aviation fuel, line service, hangar, and cargo-handling operations to Denver-based Ross Aviation. Ross is consolidating fuel services at Spokane International Airport, having also purchased XN Air, the other fuel provider based at KGEG. The XN Air Executive Terminal will be the new base of operations for all aviation fuel-related services on the airfield beginning January 10, 2012. John Chastek, currently Vice President of Operations at Spokane Airways, will be the General Manager of the new consolidated business.

Spokane Airways will continue to operate its FAA approved Flight Training Center from their current location at the Flight Center. Aircraft will still be available for rent, without interruption, to local pilots. The Flight Center will provide FAA authorized Aircraft Maintenance Services to both Corporate and Private aircraft as before, including on-demand



maintenance for the many Airlines serving Spokane International Airport. Spokane Airways' Aircraft Parts Department will remain open to the public during normal business hours.

Spokane Airways' Ground-Service Equipment Maintenance Shop has been an "inside the fence" operation at KGEG for many years. Though seldom noticed by the public, the many pieces of equipment used in support of passenger and cargo flight operations are a critical component of on-time aviation services. Spokane Airways will continue to provide both contractual and on-demand ground equipment maintenance at Spokane International.

FAA approved Air Charter flight services will still be available at the Flight Center, meeting the continuing demand for passenger and air-freight service in the inland northwest. Spokane Airways will also continue to provide Aircraft Dealer services, buying and selling aircraft both independently, and as the agent for private owners.

Spokane Airways has been a PSI/Laser Grade Testing Center for many years, and will still provide written exam services at the Flight Center for FAA, FCC, and Washington State L&I applicants seeking federal and state licenses and certifications.

Spokane Airways Flight Center will be open to the public Monday through Friday 08:00 to 16:30. Aircraft Rental and Flight Training services will continue to be available on Saturdays and Sundays by appointment. Please telephone 509-747-2017 with questions or for additional information.

Washington's Recreational Use Statute changes needed



RAF Executive Director Carl Hicks and I met with Washington State Representative Mark Hargrove, Senator Joe Fain, and Senator Pat Sullivan. We discussed suggested changes to the Washington State Recreational Use Statute that the RAF, WPA, WSPA, WAMA, and AOPA are supporting. These three Legislators and others will be co-sponsoring a bill drafted by Representative Hargrove. We discussed the wording of the bill, timing for its introduction, and other topics. Looks like early January for introduction. Hopefully the changes to the statute will be kept simple and read similar to what's follows below.

RAF suggested change to RCW 4.24.210 are noted below in italics:

(1)Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3) or (4) of this section, any public or private landowners, hydroelectric project owners, or others in lawful possession and control of any lands whether designated resource, rural, or urban, or water areas or channels and lands adjacent to such areas or channels, who allow members of the public to use them for the purposes of outdoor recreation, which term includes, but is not limited to, the cutting, gathering, and removing of firewood by private persons for their personal use without purchasing the firewood from the landowner, hunting, fishing, camping, picnicking, swimming, hiking, bicycling, skateboarding or other nonmotorized wheel-based activities, aviation activities including, but not limited to, the operation of airplanes, ultralight airplanes, hangliders, parachutes, and paragliders, rock climbing, the riding of horses or other animals, clam digging, pleasure driving of offroad vehicles, snowmobiles, and other vehicles, boating, kayaking, canoeing, rafting, nature study, winter or water sports, viewing or enjoying historical, archaeological, scenic, or scientific sites, without charging a fee of any kind therefore, shall not be liable for unintentional injuries to such users.

We'll see how it shakes out after their legal and bill crafting folks get through with it. The first draft was not acceptable because the bill crafters seemed to have simply cut and pasted text from other state's statutes, including some fairly limiting factors that made little sense for inclusion in the existing Washington State statute.

I'll keep you posted. For the future, hearing appearances, a grass roots support campaign, and possibly a Legislative day may keep most of us pretty busy on this project.
