Take a look at the calendar of activities put together by Doug Cheney of Martin Field at the end of this newsletter. Thanks, Doug, for your diligent work and effort.

I encourage you to fly as much as you can while this freedom is still available to us. Over the weekend of May 15-16, I flew to GA Days at Paine Field. What a thrill it was to see the meticulously restored P-51, P-47, and P-40 wheeled out of the Flying Heritage Collection Museum and flown before the crowds. I would estimate that a couple of thousand people turned out to enjoy the planes, send their kids on Young Eagle flights, and partake in the "Taste of Mukilteo". I had an opportunity to meet the Flying Heritage Collection Executive Director, Adrian Hunt, who escorted us on a behind-the-scenes tour and shared the stories behind the retrieval of the planes in Paul Allen's collection, each of which, by the way, is in flyable condition.

Locally, the Vista Field Young Eagle Rally was a great success. Perfect weather helped bring out the largest turnout in years for that airport. Our eight volunteer pilots gave rides to 80 Young Eagles. Aviation is still alive and continues to appeal to people of all ages.

Thanks to the WPA and a number of local supporters, we remain optimistic about Vista Field's future. With five Kennewick City Council members and two Port of Kennewick Commissioners up for election, it is a unique opportunity to fill those positions with people who see the value of airports and have a vision for what Vista Field truly could be. The filing date is the week of June 1-5. If you know of anyone who is interested in running, have him or her contact me. We need strong candidates with a passion for the needs of the community.

Our plight to save Vista Field has not gone unnoticed. We have support from people throughout the state and even across the country. Next Meeting—Meet the AOPA

In *Horton Hears a Who* by Dr. Seuss, it took the collective cry of the community to receive a response to the people of Whoville. Kennewick's collective cry may have finally been heard.

Heidi Williams, Senior Director of Airports, representing the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA) will be coming all the way from Frederick, Maryland to the Tri-Cities to talk to the local pilots. She will discuss Vista Field, tell what the AOPA is doing to help, and let you know what you can do to save Vista Field. She will also talk about the latest developments with the TSA directive, the new rules for crossing the U.S. borders, and will open the meeting up for questions.

Earlier in the day, Heidi will tour Vista Field and meet with the Port Director. With airports facing closure across the country, we are fortunate to have AOPA make a special stop here in the Tri-Cities.

The meeting starts at 6:30 pm at Bergstrom Aircraft at the Tri-Cities Airport, Pasco.

WPA Hears from Pasco Director of Airports

Director of Airports Jim Morasch of the Port of Pasco was the guest speaker at the April WPA Tri-Cities meeting. He gave a brief history of the airport, which exploded from a little airstrip amid a few farmers' fields to an important Naval Air Training Station during WWII. Over 2000 acres were turned over to the U.S. Government. Amazingly, the Port still owns over 2000 acres today!

Discussing the growth and projects that have occurred to date, Mr. Morasch said the Stimulus Package will enable the Port to improve its runways and take care of projects which would otherwise have to wait until the Port had the funds.

Pilots questioned the impact the TSA Directive 8F (SD-08F) requiring badges and background checks will have on pilots and their guests using the airport. Mr. Morasch stated that the directive is an imposition on everyone and the airport management has written letters of protest. Although they are hoping for delays, the directive is expected to take effect on June 1st. The directive does not provide funding, yet the program would carry a high cost to the airport and its users for the background checks, the badges, and replacing security gate equipment.

The pilots appreciated the frank discussion and sincere answers to their questions. A special thanks to Mr. Jim Morasch for his time and interest in speaking to the Tri-Cities WPA!

New Rules for Flying Outside the U.S.

If you plan any flights that depart or return to the USA, Customs & Border Protection (CBP) is implementing a new rule requiring advance notification of the flight and passengers aboard effective at midnight tonight. You MUST notify CBP via the internet only at least 60 minutes before your departure from any US airport or foreign airport. It applies to any flight outside the Continental US. The system is called Electronic Advance Passenger Information System, or eAPIS.

If you have been procrastinating, the time is now to register with CBP. You will have to await their reply message (may take a couple of days) with your unique Sender ID and initial password. Here's the link to register, <u>https://eapis.cbp.dhs.gov/</u>.

Before you can file a departure, you will have to login to the same CBP site, with the ID and password sent to you and reset your password. CBP is requiring changes to the password every 90 days. After successful login, establish your "Crew & Pilot Information." You must use the current information on your pilot certificate and passport. If you changed your mailing address, but not your pilot certificate, that could be a problem. Time to get rid of that paper certificate. Besides, you will need a certificate that says "English Proficient" by March 2010.

PRINT a copy of everything CBP sends you when you file a manifest, take it with you on the flights, call the CBP facility at your arrival airport in the US at least 60 minutes before your ETA. It is not clear to any CBP personnel whether the eAPIS replaces the normal report we have made for years.

If you encounter any problems, get the CBP officer's name or badge number. AOPA would be interested in identifying any problems.
